#### On the PA Turnpike:

#### From the East (New York, New Jersey, Connecticut, Boston):

- Travel West on 1-276 to Exit 20 Mid County (Philadelphia, Chester)
- Bear left for 1-476 South to Exit 13 (St. David's/Villanova, Route 30)
- At the bottom of the exit, turn left onto Route 30 West
- · The Radnor Hotel is a quarter mile on the right side

#### From the West (Western PA, Ohio):

- Travel East on I-76 to Exit 326 (Valley Forge)
- Continue East on I-76 (Schuylkill Expressway/ Philadelphia) to Exit 331A (Chester, I-476 South)
- Take I-476 South to Exit 13 (St. David's/Villanova, Route 30)

## Speaker: Mike Jayjock



Mike Jayjock is a Senior Analyst for The LifeLine Group and LINEA Inc. Mike also has his own LLC (Jayjock Associates). Mike has an M.S. and Ph.D. from Drexel University in Environmental Engineering & Science and he is board certified (ABIH) in the Comprehensive Practice of Industrial Hygiene. His primary research interest includes the development of betterestimating and more cost-efficient human exposure models. He has been active in the publication of his work and in participating on various committees of the EPA, International Society of Exposure Assessment, American Industrial Hygiene Association, the National Academy of Science and the European Union.

#### **IHMOD Exposure Assessment Tool**

Our presenter at the October PDC will be demonstrating the IH Mod spreadsheet on a projection screen during the course. Although it is not required, attendees may wish to bring a laptop with the IHMOD spreadsheet pre-installed, as there may be an opportunity at the end of the course to work through an example problem with the instructor using the software.



### **AIHA Memorandum of Understanding**





Local Sections and AIHA can strengthen and benefit each other; outline uniform expectations for Local Sections, the Local Section Council and AIHA; and better define the ways in which Local Sections and AIHA can support each other.

In entering into the Memorandum of Understanding, National AIHA agrees to continue to provide many services to Local Sections, including activities to enhance the profession; providing leadership training for Local Sections; and providing other resources to Local Sections. In return, the Philadelphia Section has agreed to a number of items, including development of an annual plan; monitoring local and state government affairs and activities; and providing educational and networking opportunities for members.

In addition to these requirements, the Local Section will be required to share with National AIHA a contact list of dues-paying local section members annually, to be used to promote AIHA programs, products and services. For Local Section members who are also National AIHA members, there will be no effect from the sharing of this information; for Local Section members who are not members of National AIHA, and who do not wish to receive mailings from National, there will be an "opt-out" provision, allowing you to remove yourself from such mailings.
